Commercial amphora

This clay amphora was found in a farmhouse at Asprovalta near Thessaloniki and dates from the late 4th or early 3rd century B.C. It has a conical body with a pointed base and a high cylindrical neck. Its handles bear a rectangular







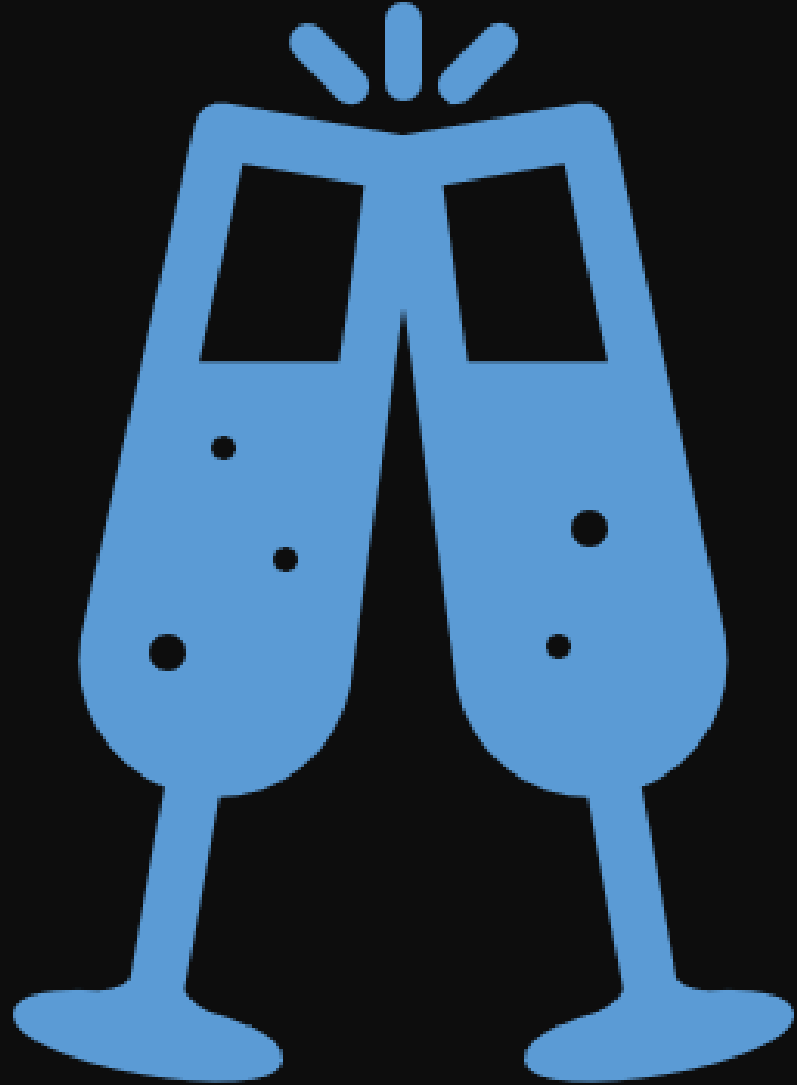
